- Nexus Center experienced a 48% increase in applied learning participation year over year
 - 2,212 students participated
- Nexus Center partnered with NYS Mentoring Program to provide support for students in grades 3-9
 - FSC students earn applied learning credit
 - Supported by \$30K SUNY Applied Learning Grant
- Applied Learning now required of all baccalaureate programs

- Applied Math and Bioscience majors
 - academically talented
 - financial need
- Partnered with six high schools
- PI: Kerry Lutz

- \$790K grant from NYS awarded to RESC for Clean Energy Workforce training
 - Lt. Governor Hochul and Chancellor Johnson attended the announcement.
- ASC's campus support increased 28% over 2017-18 with support of over \$300K – an all-time high

- 11 new scholarships totaling nearly \$1M created to support high-need students – aids in recruitment and retention
- Gifts to Foundation increased by 30 percent from July 2017 to June 2019
- Approximately \$250K invested by Foundation and Alumni Association in Raiser's Edge donor management software
- Expanded Sillcox Scholars Program
