

DELORES Y. QUINTYNE

A civil rights leader and Long Island icon, for decades Delores Y. Quintyne has been a devoted advocate at the center of the struggle for fairness and equality. She has fought effectively for fair housing and equal employment opportunity and has successfully advocated for improved working and living conditions for migrant agricultural workers. Together with her husband, Irwin, she founded the Suffolk County Congress of Racial Equality, part of one of the most important civil rights movements in our nations history. She is the recipient of the Town of Babylon Trailblazer for Civil Rights Award, the Harriet Tubman Humanitarian Achievement Award, and the Suffolk County "Shero Award" from the National Coalition of 100 Black Women. Long Island Chapter.

This building was renamed in her honor on June 15, 2021.




