Definition: Transitions link ideas, sentences and paragraphs, resulting in a smoother flow.

Explanation: Transitions improve writing by forming a bridge between ideas, avoiding awkward or sudden breaks. A coherent paper allows the reader to flow from the first supporting point to the last.

Illustration

for example, for instance, as an illustration, illustrated with, as an example, in this case

Restatement

in other words, in essence, that is, that is to say, in short, briefly, to put it differently

Similarity

comparatively, coupled with, correspondingly, likewise, similar to, moreover, together with

Sequence

first, to begin, at the same time, for now, for the present time, earlier, next, the next step, in time, in turn, later on, later, soon, meanwhile, in the meantime, while, simultaneously, afterward, in conclusion, finally

Summarizing

briefly, in brief, in conclusion, to conclude, on the whole, in summary, to summarize, in the final analysis, on balance, finally
